Increased Safety


Telemedicine can ease safety and security concerns in overcrowded jails and prisons. It reduces the need to transport inmates to see a medical or mental health provider.

Telemedicine also protects providers who are hesitant to visit a facility because of COVID-19 or other reasons, and speeds up the connection between an inmate and a provider, which is especially useful if an inmate is facing a medical or mental health crisis.

Cost Effective

The Vera Institute of Justice estimates the annual cost of incarcerating, a person in the US averages \$30, 000-\$60,000. Telemedicine helps reduce the cost of behavioral health. Paying a psychiatrist to travel long distances is quite expensive. Alternatively, transporting prisoners to healthcare professionals raises safety concerns, as well as increasing costs.

More than half million inmates are transported for care each year, costing over \$90 million.



Beyond Improved Behavioral Healthcare

<u>The Atlantic</u> reports that 55% of male inmates and 78% of female inmates within the US state prison systems are mentally ill. Telemedicine allows mental health professional to provide service to more inmates, in several locations without having to travel or enter a jail or prison. The platform can also help in other situations, such as family counseling, virtual

rehabilitation plans, court appearance and attorney meetings.



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
